Dear Barry,

I write on behalf of my many clients who receive the Tikkun Olam food parcels, to thank all who contribute to them for the wonderful deeds they do and the joy which they bring to so many.

So many families are finding things very difficult these days when the cost of living far outstrips their income. From all ages, young and old, so many feel blessed to be thought of with such kindness. Peter and his team deliver most of the parcels, but I have some delivered to the office for me to pass them on, for example,

people who live outside the delivery areas Peter and his team can manage. I have seen faces light up in delight when I pass on your parcels to them. I also get glowing testaments from my clients who meet with Peter and his team when they drop the parcels off to the clients themselves. Fortunately, Peter has met some of the clients who pick up parcels from my office when their visits have coincided, when Peter and his team have been there and they have spoken of how the parcels have cheered their lives, often when they have felt alone and downhearted. Many have no relatives here, and many are isolated, and your parcels simply make their day. Also, mothers speak of the delight their children get "opening up" the parcels which brings treats they can't afford. They often ask me to pass on their gratitude to you and your group. For all your group does for those of us in the West, my heartfelt thanks, as always.

Melbourne Tikkun Olam Report: - Barry Buirski and team

This financial year has been challenging, yet with many unexpected blessings. We have changed the way that we buy and deliver the food to the team leaders in Sydney, Adelaide and Queensland. Previously all food was



sourced from a kosher outlet here in Melbourne. However, since we have had to move out of our building in Caulfield South due to renovations, this process has no longer become viable. We now use a major supermarket chain, which delivers the kosher food directly to each team leader. This

method is much more efficient and provides a cost saving.

During the past few years, we have consistently been witnessing the love and genuine concern of our

Messiah Yeshua to a very Orthodox Jewish family. In this past year, this family has needed to move their home. It so happened that they moved to a house directly next door to a church. At first, I was not aware of where they had moved to, until I was invited to speak at this church. On arrival at the church, I was told that their Jewish neighbours were the family we were ministering to



through Tikkun Olam. Furthermore, a couple of years ago I met with another Jewish believer in Yeshua here in Melbourne. At that meeting, I learnt that he was a pastor and had temporarily stopped in his calling to help his wife with their art business. That same pastor had then been called to this same church where our Jewish family that we had been witnessing to had come to live next door to. When I learnt all of this, my heart rejoiced in thankfulness to Yeshua for His loving-kindness. I do believe there are no coincidences with God. only divine appointments. The church has begun to reach out to this Jewish family with God's love.



We have had on occasion a Jewish man come to help us with the packing and delivering of Tikkun Olam hampers. This is how it came about through his wife's email to me. "Good morning Barry, Thank you for this email. I apologise for my late response. Do you still need a helping hand in packing and delivering? I'm working that day, but my husband has some time that day and is able to assist. His name is AR, he's from Israel (Not a believer yet), but thinks helping the Holocaust survivors is an important thing. Please let me know if it's okay. Thank you D." On AR's arrival to help the team of Tikkun Olam volunteers, the team truly shone with God's love and testimony and right there before AR even had a chance to help, he heard of

Yeshua's great love for him through our volunteer's testimonies. It was a wonderful God-given moment. Later that day, I met with AR and asked him if he would come to help us again, and he said yes.

A hamper recipient writes:

"Dear Barry and all the wonderful volunteers and staff at Tikkun Olam, we really appreciate the very useful and thoughtful hampers you bring to us with blessings from your volunteers. It's so lovely to meet such wonderful and compassionate people who make me feel much calmer knowing that amongst the shameful growing tide of anti-Semitism, there are those kind persons who love and support us. Recently my synagogue held a gathering for "Nations Bless Israel". Unfortunately I could not attend as I had just had surgery, but I heard wonderful reports and I hope this becomes more commonplace. The knowledge that you support us and love Israel is a comfort beyond words or measure. Thank you for your continued support, prayers and practical assistance with the hampers, which my children also enjoy, and meeting the volunteers too, My blessings for your continued strength and our joint efforts in keeping our beautiful Israel a shining beacon of democracy amongst the wolves. A MIRACULOUS TESTIMONY

A few months ago I received a phone call from Shoshana. She had received my phone number from someone she had met in the supermarket. She said that she had heard that we help those in the Jewish community with food hampers and would she qualify. I took down her details and then met with her. Shoshana is an Israeli woman who came to live in Australia with her son through marriage.

As she told us her story, it became clear that she was struggling and had some major setbacks in her life. Her husband had passed away and she was dealing with much grief. A few weeks back, Shoshana needed to go into hospital because she desperately needed a hip replacement. During this time of immense discomfort and pain, I visited her in hospital with a Hebrew speaking colleague as interpreter. I decided to give her the book Isaiah 53 Explained. We met with her again when she came out of hospital and was well enough to be home. We asked her opinion on the Isaiah 53 book we had given her. She had read some of it but still needed to finish it. I asked her what she thought about the portion she did read. Her reply was that earlier her son had given her a copy of the Jesus Movie to watch, and when she viewed it, it all became clear to her what had happened for us, the Jewish nation, so long ago. She now believed that Yeshua had taken upon Himself her sins at the cross, and he bled and died for the salvation of the nation of Israel. Because He did this, she believed that He was her saviour, and for all Israel. Our conversation was a mix of Hebrew and English and when she declared her faith in Yeshua my colleague almost fell off her chair. I knew Shoshana had come to a genuine faith in Yeshua as her Messiah through the Jesus Movie. She explained to us that it was a struggle for her to understand this through reading a book. However, when she watched the movie it became clear. I rejoice in the fact that God did this for Shoshana. I am still curious about Shoshana's son and look forward to the time when we will sit down to discuss this matter.
